

## CUSTOMS REGULATIONS FOR IMPORTATION OF HOUSEHOLD GOODS IN FRANCE

### Documents required for importation of personal effects only

1	<b>Express Bill of Lading / Airway Bill</b>
2	<b>Detailed packing inventory</b>
3	<b>Copy of shipper's passport</b> <i>(main pages)</i>
4	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Certificat de non cession</b> <i>(provided by ACR)</i></p> <p>A statement from the shipper attesting that the goods being imported have been owned and used by the shipper for more than 6 month prior to the move and that they will not be resold for at least 12 months after importation.</p>
5	<p><b>Letter supplied by shipper's</b> employer in France, stating that he is being relocated to France by them for employment reasons and confirming he has been living out of France during the last 12 months, if applicable.</p>
6	<p><b>OR Change of residence certificate</b> obtainable from the French Consulate at the place of origin.</p>
7	<p><b>A fully detailed valued inventory</b> in French for customs purposes signed by shipper <i>(provided by ACR)</i></p>
8	<p><b>Proof of French residency</b> (rental agreement or act of property).</p>

**If shipper cannot provide the above documents, taxes and duties may apply.**


*Please note that the above information may change according to the shipper's nationality and length of stay abroad. Please ensure that further information is obtained from us prior to shipment, if you eventually decide to consign this shipment to our care.*

### IMPORTATION OF WINE/ALCOHOL

In the case shipper declares alcoholic beverages along with personal effects, please note that a detailed wine list is required *(provided by ACR)* and that duties and taxes are applicable (assessment by the customs – an estimate can be provided upon presentation of a detailed alcohol list).

### Document required for importation of Vehicle

#### Original Certificate of Title



In order to avoid customs duties and taxes, **THE CERTIFICATE OF TITLE** must be on the shipper's name for more than 6 months prior to exportation. You also need to make sure that the vehicle is in conformity with the European norms. Please contact us for guidance.
